Nutrition- Priority to Homebound Meals	Provision, to an eligible client or other eligible participant, at the client's place of residence, a meal which meets the standards established by the Older Americans Act and complies with the Dietary Guidelines for Americans published by the Secretaries of the Department of Health and Human Services and the United States Department of Agriculture. 5. Transportation- Priority to Medical and Assisted Transportation	Provides safe transportation for access to services such as: nutrition, medical services, social services, adult day care, shopping and socialization. 6. Respite Adult Day Care Voucher Respite Programs Senior Companion- Caregiver Relief	Refers to those services provided to eligible recipients who are unable to care for themselves. These services are furnished on a short-term basis because of the absence or need for relief of those persons normally providing the care. Provides planned care for dependent adults in a supervised, protective, congregate setting during some portion of a day. A voucher service program subsidizes the cost of an essential service provided to an individual 60 years or older, or as eligible age is defined by the funding sources. This service provides supportive companionship services in an effort to maintain the independence of persons 60 years of age and older who are homebound and dependent on a caregiver for support. Companion Services	A non-medical care, supervision and socialization service provided to the functionally impaired adult in his/her home or place of residence, which provides temporary relief for the primary caregiver. 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Oversight of Care Activities	Service is a process by which client needs are identified, and services to meet those needs are located, coordinated, and monitored. EPS services are provided statewide; however, in Clark County, investigations are coordinated with the Clark County Senior Citizens Protective Services Unit. Clark County Senior Citizens Protective Services Unit (CCSCPS): Receives and investigates reports of abuse, neglect, exploitation or isolation of persons 60 years of age and older who are living in the community in Clark County and are not eligible for Medicaid.
